From the Historian...

I attended a Donald Ross Society Historians forum on April 13-15 at the Pinehurst Resort in Pinehurst North Carolina. There were 29 Donald Ross Historians in attendance. The forum shared ideas on historical documents, renovation histories, club histories and marketing the Donald Ross brand. The meeting started with Audrey Moriarty the executive director of the Tufts Archives welcoming all members. This led to many panel discussions throughout the weekend. We finished up playing Pinehurst #1 where it all started.

Before the forum I met with Audrey and had all of the original Donald Ross correspondence, the club history, and the 100 year story in the Times Observer digitized. I also donated a pin flag to hang on the wall where they have 200+ flags from Donald Ross courses. Later that day, I met with John McClain the current captain of the Tin Whistles at their clubhouse. I gave them a copy of the 100 years and it now hangs on the wall of the clubhouse. I discovered that along with Marshall Parshall, the first captain and winner of the Tin Whistle Cup in 1904, that Horace Crary and Carl Gildersleeve were also original members. We are discussing having a group of Tin Whistles come to Warren to play CVCC this summer as it is the 100 year anniversary of the Presidents Cup and the club championship which were both won by Marshall Parshall in 1918.
