## From the Historian...

Conewango Valley Country Club was founded in 1916 by three original members. They were C.T Conarro, Horace Crary and Marshall Parshall. In 1918, the President's Cup and the club championship were won by Marshall Parshall. During the Depression, Horace Crary bought up most of the stock and had controlling interest. Sometime after WW2 he decided to build lower green on old 8 now 12 because he didn't want to climb the hill to the green. The club stayed 9 holes until Edmund Ault provided the expansion plans for the new nine holes in 1966. The expansion was completed along with the reopening of the upper green on old 8 now 12 in 1973 when you take the cart path from 8 to 9 you will see a sign Cleveland Drive, named for Lloyd Cleveland who was a major force behind the expansion.
